Site Progress

- The traffic management at Byres Road has been removed for the Christmas break.
- This will be reinstated in January when works to the opposite carriageway on University Avenue commence and will be in place until March 2020.

Christmas Working:

Social Value at the James McCune Smith Learning Hub

Creating Social Value and delivering a positive socio-economic impact has been a core part of our delivery at the James McCune Smith Learning Hub project. We have worked in partnership with our supply chain, community partners and the University of Glasgow to deliver a range of employment and skills outcomes, local business and social enterprise opportunities and community projects.

Our highlights include:

- 47 unemployed people employed on the project
- 46 work placements
- £292k spent with social enterprises and supported businesses
- 979 pupils and students engaged
- **For every £1 spent there has been £1.87 of social and economic impact**

Look Ahead

- The Pontecorvo Building will be fully wrapped to reduce noise and dust during the demolition process, which will commence in January 2021.
- We will be using the Virology Building plot adjacent to Church St to crush demolition material. This process allows us to reuse the material elsewhere on the campus reducing our overall waste and the number of wagons visiting site to remove excess material.
- We will restrict this activity to between the hours of 9am and 4pm and we will erect a fence clad with acoustic panels around the crusher to reduce noise. There will also be perimeter hoarding on Church St and we will continue to monitor noise, dust and vibration at the site perimeter.
- Work to University Place will continue with drainage, hard landscaping and tree pits, alongside the landscaping works to University Avenue.
