## Site Progress – 2022 Highlights

- As 2022 draws to a close, we thought we would take the opportunity to reflect on some of the highlights achieved on the University of Glasgow's Campus Development:
- Adam Smith Business School topped out on 12<sup>th</sup> September, celebrating the building reaching it's highest point.
- Advanced Research Centre (ARC) building officially opened on the 8<sup>th</sup> June, housing hundreds of academics, postdoctoral researchers and PhD students.
- Infrastructure project is effectively complete, with any remaining works under the Adam Smith Business School.
- Overall, we have engaged with over 300 students across the projects in 2022.

### Site Progress

- The Institute of Health and Wellbeing is at the final stages, with final inspections nearing completion.
- The internal fit-out is complete, with the majority of learning and teaching spaces ready for occupation in the new year.
- The majority of the works undertaken by the infrastructure project are now largely complete.
- Blue Badge bays on University Place were unfortunately delayed due to the cold weather as white lining had to be paused. It is expected to be completed and handed back to the council before Christmas.

### Project Look Ahead

- The Institute of Health and Wellbeing will be handed over to the University within the next few weeks.
- The University will continue with furniture installation and remaining works prior to occupation.
- For the Adam Smith Business School, looking ahead to the new year, the works continue on all fronts with testing and commissioning beginning in March.
- The Adam Smith Business School remains on track for project completion in the mid-summer.
- The Campus Development site will shut down for Christmas on the 23/12/22 and work will restart on 03/01/23.

## Community Update

- We hosted an alcohol awareness day at the project office with our occupational nurse. This was a great opportunity to have open and honest discussions around alcohol.
- The team at the Campus Development project got together to enjoy a Christmas dinner and celebrated the hard work of the operatives over the recent months.
- This month we have been supporting the charity KidsOut by purchasing gifts and days out for children in refuge this Christmas.

## Environmental Update

- The Adam Smith Business School received its latest score from the Considerate Constructors Scheme (CCS), who visit every 6 months, achieving an Excellent 43/45 score (*average score for all CCS assessed University sites in last 12 months is 41.58*).
- Following on from our success at the VIBES awards, the team hosted a film crew to showcase the work done at the University of Glasgow.
- Four Multiplex Graduates based at the University of Glasgow project attended Constructionarium in King's Lynn as part of their Graduate Programme. They gained first hand experience of planning and delivering a construction project in the form of a scale version of the Brewery Wharf footbridge bridge in Leeds.
