The new campus will create a rich mix of community, public engagement and social spaces and enhance engagement between the University and the city.



Site Progress


- Cementation Skanska, who are delivering the piling works, have successfully completed 420 piles out of a total of 683.
- With the team making good progress, one of the large piling rigs has been demobilised, leaving 2nr large rigs and the mini-rig.
- Piling mat installation is progressing to allow the 16nr tower crane piles to be installed for the 4nr cranes that will be required to deliver the project. Piles have subsequently been installed for tower cranes 1 & 3, with 2 & 4 to follow.
- The lower platform foundations for the new welfare on Plot C have been completed.




Prefabricated reinforcement cages for install

Look Ahead

- The site will be closed over Christmas from 20th December to 6th January, however a security presence will be retained over this period.
- Subcontractor Careys will return to the Campus Development in the new year, having worked on many of the completed buildings, to deliver the sub & superstructure of the Keystone Building.
- Main concrete works will kick-off at the end of January with the installation of the capping beam, which ties the pile caps together in preparation for the concrete slab.
