Introduction

Welcome to the latest edition of the University of Glasgow Campus Development newsletter.

This newsletter is issued by the university's appointed project delivery partner, Multiplex, for and on behalf of the Campus Development team. Each newsletter will provide an update from the project including the latest site works as well as a look ahead at planned activities.

The University of Glasgow is currently undertaking a £1.3 billion Campus Development programme, which includes the redevelopment of the 14-acre former Western Infirmary site, building a mix of modern research, teaching and public spaces.

The new campus will create a rich mix of community, public engagement and social spaces and enhance engagement between the University and the city.

Keystone Launch

- Construction of the Keystone Building commenced this month, with completion scheduled for the 2028/29 academic year. The development is projected to cost £300million.
- The Keystone Building is the fifth major building to be constructed through the University of Glasgow's £1.3 billion Campus Development Programme. It will be a world-class facility dedicated to learning, teaching, and research, and accommodate around 3,600 students.
- The new development will span a total of 27,000 square metres, making it the second largest building on the University's campus by size, after the Gilbert Scott Building.
- Designed by HOK architects and constructed by the University's principal contractor, Multiplex, the building will serve as a hub for students of all disciplines and offer a mix of teaching spaces, technical facilities, collaborative areas and a café.
- Alongside general learning and teaching areas, the Keystone Building will house a range of dry and wet lab spaces, as well as high-spec computing labs. It will also provide a maker's workshop and general teaching facilities for the University of Glasgow's James Watt School of Engineering.
